Judge admits teen's statements in murder trial

.6-year-old charged n beating death

HAMILTON — A Springfield 'ownship teenager's statements bout his involvement in a fatal st fight will be admissible at his pcoming murder trial. Adrian Reynolds, 16, of Mer-

dith Drive, is charged with murer in connection with the beatng death of 17-year-old Brandon Aitchell of Fairfield during an .ug. 13 fight behind the Fairfield 'oint apartment complex at 129

)anube Drive. Reynolds said he acted in self efense and that the fight was raially motivated, according to his ttorney, Clyde Bennett.

Reynolds' trial is scheduled for Aarch 7 in Butler County Comnon Pleas Court. The Journal-Jews is naming him because he is eing tried as an adult.

On Tuesday, Bennett, sought o suppress statements Reynolds ave to police. Fairfield Police Officer Becky

Ervin testified that when Reynilds was arrested at a nearby partment after the fight, he told er two white males - refering to Mitchell and his friend - cursed at Reynolds' group of riends and tried to start a fight. Reynolds said he punched one of the white males two to three

his face, Ervin said. Detective

Sandy Sears tes-

tified Reynolds

gave a written statement later evening in which he said Mitchell's group of friends started cursing and making racial slurs toward Reynolds and his

friends. "I said 'What did you say?' and he called me a (expletive) and got in my face and ... he put up his guard and tried to hit me," Reynolds wrote in the statement, Sears said. "I moved and closed my eyes and swung three times. I opened my eyes and he was on the ground and the other guy he was with came and hit me in the head with a

Reynolds said he didn't know whether he had kicked Mitchell, according to the statement. Reynolds also wrote he did not mean to hurt Mitchell. Sears testified.

glass bottle," he wrote.

"I didn't really want to fight him, it's just he tried to hit me and I'm very sorry for hitting him and I want him to know that I'm sorry," Reynolds wrote.

Reynolds had been read his Miranda rights twice that evening, police said.

Judge H. J. Bressler ruled the statements were admissible.

Defense withdraws challenge of jury

Tuesday's hearing was attended by about a dozen supporters of Mitchell. Several. including Mitchell's mother, wore T-shirts screen-printed

with Mitchell's picture. On others' T-shirts were the words "You are not forgotten Brandon Mitchell."

Friends and relatives of Reynolds also were in attendance.

Mitchell died at University Hospital of a skull fracture, according to the Hamilton County Coroner's Office. He also had sustained blunt trauma to the head and neck, the coroner's office said.

Also on Tuesday, Bennett

withdrew a motion challenging Butler County's jury selection process. He had filed the motion because he believed there were too few potential black jurors in

Butler County. However, he said that after researching the matter, he found Butler County was in compli-

ance with Ohio law on jury selections.
